

## FROM OUR PASTOR

A visioning process is just that: a process. It takes time. There are a lot of moving parts. It isn't something that happens without significant investment from all of the stakeholders as well as a deep trust where all of the participants are willing to lean in to the prospect of an uncertain future as they learn and grow together.

Often times when we think about the meaning of the word vision, all we think about is some future oriented perspective and our ability to cultivate the sight to be able to see that future. That is a very necessary part of a visioning process—the ability to look with clarity into the future and identify ideas and changes that would still be faithful to the identity and purpose of a particular congregation and call people toward those things. But it isn't the only part.

Our Discovery Team is also working through another part of the meaning of vision, a part which Craig Dykstra calls "absolutely essential" and that is perception. He calls perception "the capacity to

perceive realistically what is present," and so vision is also "the ability to see, and help others to see, the way things actually are." Data helps us do that. Multiple and varied perspectives help us do that. One story about a place or a people or an issue might be just that—one story but it might not be the true story because each of us perceive through our biases, our baggage, our own histories, and our own needs to see things as we want to see them. Maybe that's why Paul said "we all see as through a glass darkly." Maybe if enough of us are looking and perceiving we can all pull together, with the help of the Holy Spirit, a clear vision about not only where we are, but also where God wants us to go. Come and join us in that good work! We need to see what you can see.
