She said it as clearly and as confidently as any of us could ever say it: "I can look back on my life and see that God has been so faithful and so good to me even though my life hasn't always been what I thought it would be. But even though they are afraid or could be accused of not trusting, God still uses those individuals to accomplish God's purposes.

We have had some wonderful dreaming conversations over the last few weeks and as we continue to listen and to dream about what God is calling us towards as a congregation, I hope you will continue to stay engaged in the process. It is easy to think that things are done or are settled or that your voice doesn't matter or isn't heard, but that isn't the case. This is a long conversation and we need everyone in it! Thank you for your continued commitment to our church and to our future together. I am more convinced than ever that it will be the best chapter yet.
