FROM OUR PASTOR

A ministry colleague and I were having a conversation in the last few weeks related to the quality of our discourse in our country these days and how that is or isn't making its way into our congregations. I told him that I felt we did a pretty good job of recognizing and honoring the differences that we share without being ugly. He lamented that there had been too many moments where toxic patterns of relating and meanness and an unwillingness to have actual healthy conversations were the norm instead of modeling something different as a family of faith. I'm afraid his experience is more of the norm.

It can be difficult to have hard conversations as a family of faith. Some of the reason for that is that it can be really difficult for our families of origin to have hard conversations, and if we aren't in the practice of handling tough or sensitive or complex issues in healthy ways at home, then why would we be able to do that in church? We don't ask people to check their brains and their

opinions at our doors. We don't ask people to pretend that you don't care about any of it or all of it so that we can avoid talking about some of it. We don't ask people to be anything other than who they are.

Who we are when we come to church, most importantly in my opinion, is a follower of Jesus. We are brothers and sisters and sons and daughters who have said, "Jesus is my Lord". So then, we are to speak with each other, listen to each other, love each other, respect each other, and honor each other as though we are honoring no less than Jesus himself. And if we are able to do that, we will transform how we are able to talk about and deal with hard things.
