

## FROM OUR PASTOR

As I have listened to much of the commentary about the tragic fires at the three black churches in Louisiana and at Notre Dame cathedral, one of the most consistent points made has centered around what does and doesn't define a church. While it is true that the church is the people and not the building in which they meet, that isn't very helpful for those who are mourning the losses of their sacred spaces. Our sacred spaces are important to us. They are connected to some of the most significant moments we experience in life. They are places of refuge and safety and are places to grow and learn how to be more like Christ. To date, I have been a part of eight different congregations as either a member or a minister. Each of those places holds a different part of my story and I can picture every one of those spaces of worship and discipleship vividly in my mind.

What stays with me more than that though, are the people who have influenced my journey thus far. I think about the Sunday school


