# FROM OUR PASTOR

I was recently listening to a psychologist talk about grief and loss and something she said stuck out to me in a way it hadn't before. She was asked a question regarding how people deal with the different parts or different phases of grief, and she made an effort to point out that grief or that loss isn't something that we ever fully finish with. Many of us know the stages of death and dying by Elizabeth Kubler Ross and we apply that to our stages of grief, but this expert suggested we are never really finished with our grief when it is someone we deeply love. It stays with us. What we should be trying to do is to learn to live with grief and loss. Instead of it being an unwelcomed guest who has invaded our home or our space and who we are trying to get rid of, we should create a space for it and recognize that it has a place in our lives.

Part of how we do that as a church is to remember the lives of those who have been a part of our church family who have died in the previous year. As we do every year, we will remember those loved ones and saints on Sunday, November 1st which is All Saints Sunday. We do this to not only honor again the ways that these beloved brothers and sisters made a significant contribution to our lives and to our life together, but also to remember and support their family members and loved ones who are still feeling the depths of their grief. As we remember and give thanks for their lives, we also are reminded of the life that all of us have in Christ and how Christ is present to us in our grief. Thanks be to God!
