FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

Every morning, I create a "To Do" list. This list reminds me of what I need to accomplish during the day, and I enjoy checking each item off as it is completed. Most of us stay busy with multiple commitments, tasks and responsibilities. There never seems to be enough time to get everything done.

But there is a more important list which often gets neglected as we remain focused on our "To Do" list. That more important list is our "To Be" list. Too often, we mistakenly view the day as a success if all our "To Do" items are checked off. In measuring our value by what we do, we neglect the more important issue of who we are. After all, we are not human doings. We are human beings.

Our outer life of multiple activities can never fulfill us if we neglect our inner life of attitudes, values and perspectives. So, take some time each morning to think about who you are going to be during the day. Then, make your list of what you intend to do. Your being must be the inspiration for your doing.

In Galatians 5:22-23, we find the list of the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. All nine "fruits" are about being, not doing. If our inner life is filled with this work of God's Spirit, our outer, active life will be Christ-like.

Each day, I hope that you will focus on two lists: your "To Be" list and your "To Do" list. And, remember that who you are is more important than what you do.



MEDICAL DEBT CAMPAIGN

First Baptist Church of Rome plans to join together with First Baptist Church of Dalton, Heritage Baptist Church, First Baptist Church of Marietta in a medical debt campaign. RIP Medical Debt (https://ripmedicaldebt.org) will help us locate medical debt in each of our counties and in the state of Georgia that is available to be eliminated with our financial help. The debt that RIP has access to is on the secondary market, which means it is at least two years old.

Every \$1 raised can wipe out approximately \$100 of medical debt. The churches listed above will work together to raise \$50,000 to wipe out \$5 million of accessible debt in our counties and in Georgia. I'd love to answer questions and work alongside you, as members of FBC Rome, to help us toward this cooperative goal.

NEW GUIDELINES FOR FBC

The Centers for Disease Control recently issued new recommendations that apply to non-health care settings. The recommendation that specifically applies to worship and other meetings at First Baptist Church of Rome says that fully vaccinated people can now resume activities without wearing masks or physically distancing. The CDC says people are considered fully vaccinated: 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.

The following guidelines, as recommended by the CDC, will be in place for worship and other gatherings at First Baptist Church of Rome:

- Masks are not required for those who are fully vaccinated. Masks should be worn by those who are not fully vaccinated. If an attendee has a concern about nonvaccinated attendees not wearing a mask, they are encouraged to wear a mask or to worship/attend meetings virtually.
- 2. Following CDC guidelines, children and youth who are not fully vaccinated will continue to be required to wear masks.
- 3. Seating will still be on every other pew. Fully vaccinated individuals are no longer required to maintain social distance from each other.
