PAUL'S PRISON EPISTLES

Of the thirteen letters of Paul in the New Testament, four of them were written from prison in Rome around 60 A.D. His letters from prison are Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon.

In Ephesians, he wrote to encourage the believers at Ephesus to walk in accordance with their calling as followers of Christ. This letter combines theological insight about the Christian life (chapters 1-3), and ethical instruction about the way Christians should behave (chapters 4-6).

In Philippians, Paul writes to the believers at Philippi, encouraging them to find peace in their present circumstances and to rejoice because of their shared faith in Christ.

In Colossians, Paul warns the believers at Colossae about the false teaching and heresy had taken root there. So, in his letter, he refuted this heresy and encouraged the believers to continue in their faith grounded in Christ alone.

In his brief letter to Philemon, Paul asks him to forgive his slave Onesimus for stealing from his master, and escaped to Rome where he sought refuge with Paul and became a Christian. Paul encouraged Onesimus to return to his master with a letter urging Philemon to forgive Onesimus and welcome him back as a brother in Christ.

God inspired Paul to write these four letters from prison which proved to be such a powerful blessing to believers in the first century and ever since then. Paul did not focus on his imprisonment or his impending death at the hands of his Roman captors. He chose to focus on others and to help them in their walk with Christ.

What a powerful lesson his example is to us! I encourage you to read these prison letters and allow God to speak to you through their powerful truth.
