FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

THE BEATITUDES

Jesus' Sermon on the Mount is found in Matthew chapters 5-7. He begins the sermon with an illustration and concludes with one (the parable of the wise and foolish builders, 7:24-27).

Speaking to a large crowd outdoors, perhaps on a hillside near the north shore of the Sea of Galilee, Jesus used an opening illustration which we call, The Beatitudes. This eight-part introduction to His sermon assures you that if you apply all of them to your life, you will be blessed.

The word, "Blessed", opens each of the eight beatitudes (Matthew 5:3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10-11) and that word refers to the ultimate well-being and distinctive spiritual joy of those who share in the salvation which God offers us through His Son. Together, the beatitudes represent a spiritual path for you to follow, a path which is both demanding and inspiring. If you live by them, you will experience an abundance of spiritual blessings and rewards.

Perhaps you can better apply the Beatitudes to your Christian life by calling them "The Be-Attitudes", because all eight focus on your attitudes, your inner self. They are meant to be internalized, deep in your soul, which is the source of your values and your identity as a follower of Christ. Jesus knows that if your inner self is Christ-like, your outer self will be Christ-like through your words and your behavior.

I encourage you to read each of the Beatitudes thoughtfully and prayerfully. Allow them to give shape to your spiritual identity by resolving to apply them more fully to who you are and who you want to be.

Jesus opened His sermon with the Beatitudes because He knew how important they are for every believer. If you will live by them, you truly will be "Blessed".

BRIDGES OUT OF POVERTY UPDATE

The current Getting Ahead Cohort are all employed, all have homes of their own, and one has gotten a drivers license along with veteran benefits reinstated. The Getting Ahead program is quietly doing great work with investigators in our community.

COVID RELIEF FUNDS (direct impact to families still behind because of loss of employment or sickness related to COVID)

FBC Missions committee voted to give \$100,000 worth of relief funds to the following agencies:

- \$25,000 to Good Neighbor for assistance with bills immediate need and no cap on assistance amounts
- \$25,000 to Good Neighbor for assistance with housing immediate need and no cap on assistance amounts
- \$25,000 to South Rome Alliance Early Learning Center Support for children/preschoolers in a high needs area of town

MEALS FOR HOSPITAL WORKERS

When a hospital Chaplain's Office wrote describing the exhaustion experienced by hospital staff due to the COVID pandemic, we sought ways to offer encouragement. In addition to prayers and written notes, we found that some workers struggle to leave the hospital for meals. Floyd Medical Center has already receive over 300 individually packaged meals delivered on behalf of our church. Redmond Regional Medical Center suggested that packaged snack items would be most helpful to their staff. So along with notes of encouragement their breakrooms are stocked with power bars and energy drinks. Thanks to the generosity of many who are making this possible.
