

### FROM OUR PASTOR

I often say that my favorite part of being a pastor is caring for people. Whether I am preaching a sermon, sharing in a conversation, leading a meeting, attending a football game on Friday night, or visiting someone who is hospitalized, I do my best to empathize and authentically care for you with the love and compassion of Christ. I care about what matters to you—your family and your joys, but also your struggles, stresses, and fears. And God cares, too.

Centuries ago, the apostle Paul had the privilege of serving as a pastor in various churches. He started the very first churches in places like Corinth, Ephesus, and Galatia. But he didn't do it all by himself. He had partners and assistants who were called by God to share the good news and care for those early congregations. One of those young partners was Timothy, who grew to become a wonderful pastor for the church at Ephesus. As Timothy served as the pastor at Ephesus, Paul guided him and mentored him with wise words of instruction and encouragement. We can read Paul's instructions to Timothy in the New Testament letters of 1 and 2 Timothy—commonly known as the Pastoral Epistles. We might say that these two letters are words that come *"From a Pastor's Heart."* 

Starting this Sunday, we will turn our attention to 1 and 2 Timothy for a few weeks—seven in all—to hear from the heart of a pastor. We'll learn more about how to be the church and how to grow in our faith together. As we do, I hope you will hear from my heart as your pastor who genuinely cares for you.

#### PARKING DECALS

When attending meetings and activities at FBC during weekdays, parking is available in two lots on First Street — the Chapel lot, and the lot adjacent to the Floyd County Building. When parking next to the Floyd County Building during the week, you must park ONLY in the two



center rows (Spaces 24-49). They are marked "First Baptist Reserved".

A parking decal, available in the church office, should be placed in the rear wind-shield on the driver's side. The lot is monitored by the Downtown Development Authority. If you do not have a decal, you may receive a parking citation. Decals are not necessary on Sundays.
