## FROM OUR PASTOR

Now that we are well into the season of Lent, I wonder how you are doing? Did you give up something for Lent? Did you take on a new discipline or practice? If you did, then chances are you have had good days and bad. You've taken three steps forward, then two steps back. It would be nice if we could all be perfect in our discipleship, but none of us get it right all of the time. That is no reason to fret, though. Lent is not about perfection. Instead, Lent is a time for us to be open to the overwhelming grace of God—a grace that enables us to follow Christ, to receive forgiveness, and to start afresh with God every day.

The grace of God given to us through Christ is also our model for how we are called to relate to one another. Jesus gave us this model from the cross as he prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). Jesus—nailed to the cross and dying a terrible and painful death—prays for his enemies. He prays for forgiveness. He asks God to be merciful. And he offers this prayer to the Father out loud, for everyone to hear. He could have prayed the prayer silently, but because he voiced that prayer aloud, we know his prayer today, and it is a model—a call—for us to extend the same grace and forgiveness to one another.

Who has hurt you, ignored you, offended you? Who needs your forgiveness and love today? To whom do you need to extend a place at your table, a second chance, an opportunity to make things right? Perhaps these days of Lent can be the right time for you to be more grace-giving and loving then you have been in the past. After all, if Jesus could offer grace as he was dying on the cross, surely, we can offer God's grace as we live each day carrying our crosses and following our crucified Lord.
