Narrator: Keith Reaves Jesus: Choir Cleopas: Men The Other Follower: Women Narrator: That very day... the day of Jesus' resurrection... two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself approached and began traveling with them. But their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. And Jesus said to them,

Other Follower (Women): "Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just exactly as the women had said; but him they did not see."

Jesus (Choir): "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?"

Narrator: Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, he explained to them the things concerning himself in all the Scriptures. And they approached the village where they were going, and he acted as though he were going farther.

Cleopas (Men): "Stay with us, for it is getting toward evening, and the day is now nearly over."

Narrator: So he went in to stay with them. At the table with them, he took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, he began giving it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight.

Cleopas (Men): "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was speaking to us on the road, while he was explaining the Scriptures to us?"

Cleopas (Men): "We saw him on the road... on our way to Emmaus. But we didn't recognize him until he broke the bread and handed it to us."
