WEAR RED

MAY 28

Remember to wear red in worship on May 28 as we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, marking the birth of the Christian church by the power of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost literally means "fiftieth day" and is celebrated fifty days after Easter. Red, the color associated with this day, recalls the tongues of flame in which the Holy Spirit descended on the first Pentecost. Red also reminds us of the blood of the martyrs. These are the believers of every generation who by the power of the Holy Spirit hold firm to the true faith even at the cost of their lives.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

The Holy Land Pilgrimage is set for April 25-May 10, 2024. We will begin in Amman, Jordan (ancient Philadelphia), visit cities of the Decapolis, Mt. Nebo, Bethany Beyond the Jordan where John was baptizing, the Dead Sea, Petra, and the desert of Wadi Rum (where Moses wandered). In Israel we will visit stay in Jericho, Galilee, and Jerusalem — walking many of the same paths that Jesus and his first disciples walked. 

DORIS WHITE

DORIS WHITE; BEAUTICIAN AND HER LEGACY

Doris White was a single business woman who operated a beauty shop out of her home on Avenue A. At her death in 1971, Doris instructed that her home be given to the church. Missionaries on furlough could stay there free of charge. However, the house wasn't well suited for this purpose and was sold and the income used to establish the Memorial Gifts Fund (now the FBC Foundation). The income from this gift provided a "missionary apartment" in Rome and since 2004 the Doris White Grant has paid housing expenses while CBF missions personnel are in the states.
