FROM OUR PASTOR

ISN'T THAT IN THE BIBLE?

How well do you know the Bible? If we are honest, we all know that there is always more to learn from the Bible than what we currently know. And if we take time to read the Bible carefully, we might be surprised to find some things that are *not* in the Bible. Some examples: "Spare the rod, spoil the child." "Early to bed and early to rise makes a man healthy, wealthy and wise." "Cleanliness is next to Godliness." Can you think of others?

We have to be careful. Why? Because words that sound biblical but are not biblical can powerfully shape our *mis*understanding of God. And when we say and believe things about God that are not true, we can sow distrust of God within ourselves and among other people.

Let's take some time over the next three Sundays in our worship series—*Isn't That in the Bible?*—to consider three very popular but unbiblical statements:

- Sep 10 Everything Happens for a Reason?
- Sep 17 God Helps Those Who Help Themselves?
- Sep 24 God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle?

All of these sound biblical, but they are not. The good news is that there are teachings in the Bible that help us to understand God more authentically and honestly that what these popular statements assert. I look forward to exploring these teachings with you.


CHURCH PICNIC
