

Are you ready for Christmas? Of course not! Christmas is still three months away. But believe it or not, now is a good time to prepare your heart, soul, and mind for Christmas. And to help you do so, I invite you to participate in a wonderful study based on Adam Hamilton's book, *The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem*. Following the

footsteps of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and others, we will learn fascinating details about the Christmas story that will help you to worship the newborn king more fully this year when Christmas arrives.

The five-week study will take place every Wednesday evening in our fellowship hall, from 6:15 – 7:10 pm, beginning October 18 and concluding on November 15. Each week, we will focus on one chapter of The Journey and the stories from the Gospels that correspond with each chapter. As part of the study, we will also enjoy short video segments each week—hosted by Adam Hamilton—to introduce us to the people and places that are included in the Christmas story. Reading *The Journey* is not a requirement for the study, but if you would like your own copy for the study, copies of the book are available in the church office for \$13. You can also purchase a copy online.

It may seem premature to turn our attention in October to Mary, Joseph, Bethlehem, and the birth of Jesus. But look at it this way: the Christmas rush has not hit yet. You don't have to do any shopping or baking or decorating. Taking time to get your heart, mind, and soul ready for Christmas now can be an early Christmas gift that God is giving to you. I hope you will receive it gladly and join me on Wednesday nights for *The Journey*.
