



"Discovering Our Overlapping History" The Sunday, July 4, 2021, New York Times gave front page coverage to Stacie Marshall who had recently inherited her family's farm in Chattooga County, GA. She had uncovered family records that included an enslaved wet-

nurse named Hester. Almost 150 years after her passing, the descendants of Hester and her enslavers lived as neighbors and friends. They prayed, worshiped, and shared meals together, not knowing their shared history until 2021. In light of this discovery, descendants of both families joined together to create Hester's Heritage Foundation with the intent of supporting equal justice in black history preservation, education, and black farming initiatives. Stacie, along with Melvin and Betty Mosley, will be joined by Virginia Bolton to share this remarkable story.
